Knowing the early signs of a heart attack and acting quickly can save your life.

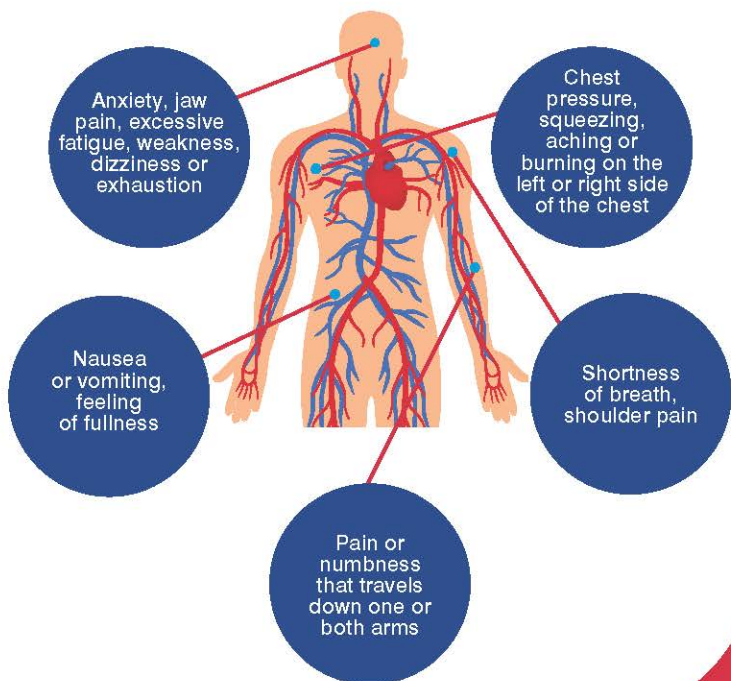
DID YOU KNOW?

Early symptoms occur in 50% of heart attack patients.

Early Heart Attack Care (EHAC) is a program designed to help you recognize these signs as early as weeks before the actual attack. If you think you or someone around you may be having a heart attack, call 9-1-1 immediately. We want to treat you before permanent heart damage occurs.

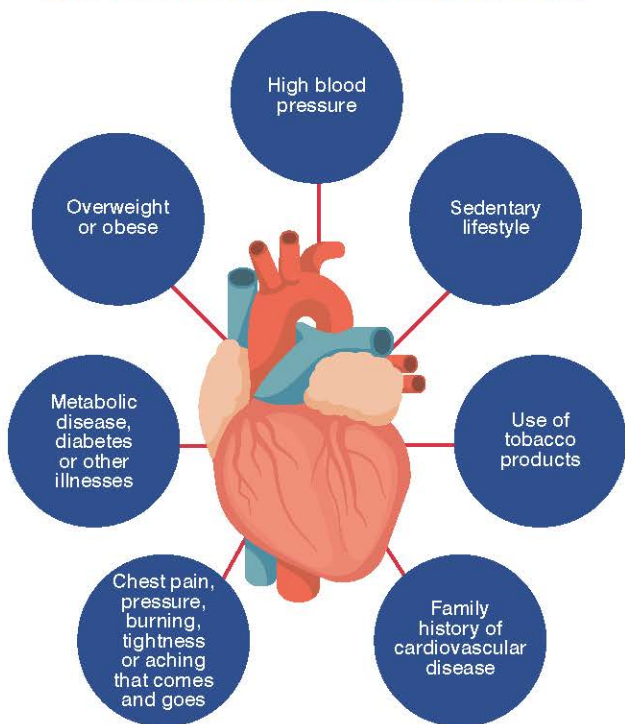

Most heart damage occurs within the first two hours of a heart attack.

About 750,000 people in the U.S. have heart attacks each year. Of those, about 116,000 die.
